## On the Hungarian-related aspects of Bubrikh's life and work

In this paper, I attempt to collect the Hungarian-related aspects from the life and work of D. V. Bubrikh, the father of Soviet Finno-Ugric studies. Some examples from his work for such lesser known texts on the Hungarian language are as follows: an entry about the history of the Hungarian language in the Literary Encyclopedia of the Communist Academy (1929); two letters of his as preserved by the Library of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences (1926 from Leningrad, 1927 from Berlin); the grammar appendix of the 1947 Russian–Hungarian pocket dictionary. He considered the Collegium Hungaricum in Berlin exemplary from the point of scientific management; he started the introduction of Hungarian language at university level. It is unclear whether he was aware of the Hungarian-language publications from and about him in the years preceding his unexpected death in 1949.
