Historical misconceptions in the Hungarian language (uralistical stories)

There are elements in Hungarian morphology that are almost imperceptible as they are pushed to the periphery, and some of them may have fallen "victim" to erroneous and irrational linguistic historical explanation attempts. Cotrary to traditional understanding, the author derives all of the Sg2. -d, -l, -sz endings from the corresponding personal pronoun.

The author reconstructs Pl1. personal endings in Finno-Ugric *-uk/*-ük and *-muk/*-mük forms.

In Hungarian, the Finno-Ugric *t can be found in ablative adverbs, e.g. *innét* (*innejd*, *innent*, *innend*) meaning 'from here'.
